Until the 17th century, Norwich was Britain's second biggest city with its wealth built on trading. This has created a very rich tradition of heritage especially in the city centre, which boasts the largest intact medieval street pattern in Europe. Norwich City centre combines old and new beautifully, whilst still retaining its own character.

Norwich offers an outstanding quality of life, fantastic career options and the benefits of living in a vibrant city with easy access. Visitors can enjoy a variety of museums, galleries, cafes, restaurants and other services, many of which are housed in beautiful heritage buildings which feature architecture from the Norman, Medieval, Georgian, Victorian and Modern eras.

2018 saw Norwich retain its Purple Flag status which recognises how the city centre manages the evening and night time economy. Norwich city's population is divided almost equally in gender with a total population of 140,600. The figure is expected to increase as the Government has prioritised greater Norwich as a major city that will create 35,000 new jobs and 30,000 new residents by 2026.



#### Average footfall day part















Demand for space in Norwich's office market rose to its highest level in three years, with 212,000 sq ft of requirements.




