INTRODUCTION

Norwich "The City of Stories" is located in East Anglia and is one of the most beautiful modern historic cities in Britain. Until the 17th century, Norwich was the country's second biggest city with its wealth built on trading. This has created a very rich tradition of heritage especially in the city centre, which boasts the largest intact medieval street pattern in Europe. Norwich city centre combines old and new beautifully, whilst still retaining its character and charm.


Norwich offers an outstanding quality of life, fantastic career options and the benefits of living in a vibrant city with easy access. Visitors can enjoy a variety of museums, galleries, cafés, restaurants and other services, many of which are housed in beautiful heritage buildings which feature architecture from the Norman, medieval, Georgian, Victorian and modern eras.

In 2016 Castle and Royal Arcade District was selected as a Finalist for the City Category of the Great British High Street Award and received recognition on a local and national level.

Norwich city's population is divided almost equally in gender, with a total population of 137,500. This figure is expected to increase as the Government has prioritised greater Norwich as a major city that will create 35,000 new jobs and 30,000 new residents by 2026.










FULL TIME AND PART TIME EMPLOYEES

EDUCATION OF THE POPULATION OF NORWICH



The number of Norwich-based employees has increased by 1.6%, raising the total number of employees in Norwich area to 129,200.


TOTAL NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES IN DIFFERENT SECTORS




TOTAL NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES IN NORWICH CITY COUNCIL AREA






NUMBER OF STUDENTS IN HIGHER EDUCATION




PECENTAGE OF GRADUATES WORKING OR IN FURTHER STUDY 6 MONTHS AFTER GRADUATION






NUMBER OF TRIPS TAKEN BY TOURISTS TO NORWICH








PEDESTRIAN ACTIVITY BY DAY



NORWICH MONTHLY TOTAL FOOTFALLS




PROPORTION OF PRIMARY AVAILABLE FLOORSPACE

HIGH STREET RETAIL DEMAND VS SUPPLY







RESTAURANTS, TAKEAWAY OR FOOD SHOPS BY HYGIENE RATING






TOTAL FOOTFALL FOR NORWICHTRAIN STATION








OFFICE VACANCY RATE




INDUSTRIAL SUPPLY VS DEMAND




RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY VALUE


AVERAGE PRICE FOR HOUSES SOLD IN 2016






